- Ability to work collaboratively with others
- Willingness to take initiative and accept guidance openly
- Willingness to advocate the health, income, and education of all individuals

Flexible. Dates and times vary. Volunteers should expect to serve approximately 3 + hours per month.

Work Location

Locations throughout Lake County. Volunteers may work remotely or in-the-field (as guidelines and safe practices allow).
